## INTERNSHIP COURSES

### • ETHS 495A 3 Ethnic Studies Internship Seminar (1 cr)

The internship seminar examines and reflects on the knowledge, skills, and experiences acquired from internship settings. Key questions include: What does the internship mean to one's studies as an Ethnic Studies major/minor and one's intended profession? How does the internship deepen one's understanding of one's own gifts, values, and commitments in building a just, compassionate world?

### • ETHS 495 B: Ethnic Studies Internship (3 cr)

The internship offers Ethnic Studies majors and minors firsthand knowledge, skills, and experiences related to ethnic studies. Students will work in a setting that serves racially and ethnically diverse populations.
